In 1996, Mr. Greenlee became manager of geological operations for production operations at Exxon Company USA, based in New Orleans. He was appointed manager of area geoscience fo Brazil for ExxonMobil Exploration Company in 2000 and a year later became vice president, geoscience, for Saudi Arabia.

Mr. Greenlee became upstream advisor at Exxon Mobil Corporation (NYSE:XOM) headquarters in Irving, TX, in 2002 and was appointed vice president for geoscience for Asia Pacific, ExxonMobil Exploration Company, in 2004.
